Literature Review

- Military forces are meant to defend a country's sovereignty and protect its citizens from any threats. The increasing threat of terrorism is something that countries of any scale do not take lightly. Placing soldiers directly in harm's way is the last resort taken against the growing number of terrorist organizations around the globe, and counterterrorism incorporates practice, techniques, strategy, and the military tactics governments adopt to prevent or combat terrorism (Nyadera, Bincof, 2019).
- The theories surrounding human security consistently mention the protection of every citizen and noncitizen located in a country, regardless of limiting characteristics such as country of origin or group affiliation. The role of the international community is to complement and provide the necessary support to governments, upon their request, to strengthen their capacity to respond to current and emerging threats (UN, 2016).
- The liberation of human beings from intensive, extensive, prolonged and comprehensive threats to which their lives and freedom are vulnerable is the aim of the Human Security Paradigm. The object of threat in the case of human security is individuals' lives, freedom, or both (UN, 2009).

Background Information

- The National Guard of the United States has about 450,000 soldiers total, with the Illinois branch consisting of about 12,000 soldiers within its border.
- The Illinois National Guard operates out of 46 bases spread across the state (Illinois National Guard, 2020).

Soldiers must place themselves in dangerous situations to be adequately prepared for the dangers associated with rescuing civilians. Training exercises that test the limits of what soldiers can handle seems to be the most widely used tactic for breeding the warriors that we will send into harm's way.
